



Behaviour Policy (SISW 5) Appendix A – Code of Behaviour

SCHOOL RULES

- Make sure you are clear about the rules on uniform, homework etc.
- Be familiar with ‘What we Expect of you’.
- If you think that any of the rules are unreasonable or have queries or suggestions, the School or Year Council will consider your proposals and take them to the Assistant Headteacher (pastoral) for consideration.

BEHAVIOUR IN LESSONS

- Good behaviour will increase mutual respect between teachers and students.
- Do not waste time with disruptive or attention-seeking behaviour which creates hostility and prevents others learning.
- Discuss any problems with your Head of Year or Tutor if you are concerned about any aspects of behaviour.
- Do not swear at (or in the presence of) a teacher. It will almost certainly result in a fixed-term exclusion

FRIENDLINESS

- Try to get on with others - both students and staff. Make an extra effort to include new, left out or lonely looking people.
- If there is someone you do not like, just leave them alone.
- Try not to pass judgment on others that will cause offence.
- Avoid excluding or looking down on others.
- Consider other people’s feelings at all times.

RESPECT FOR OTHER PEOPLE’S PROPERTY

- Do not move, borrow or take other people’s property without permission.
- Do not steal.
- Respect school property.
- Always put litter in the bins provided

BULLYING - SEE ANTI - BULLYING POLICY

- Do not intimidate others by your behaviour.
- Avoid deliberately offending or excluding others.
- Tell a Form Tutor, Head of Year, member of staff or friend if anything is wrong or you are being bullied. **You do not have to put up with it.**
